- English/Language Arts (reading, writing, spelling, grammar, composition)
- Mathematics
- Science
- Social Studies (history, geography, civics)
- Art
- Music
- Health
- Physical Education

Other elective subjects (such as foreign languages or religious studies like Hebrew/Torah) may be added, but are not legally required.

Parents should be prepared to show **instruction and progress** in each required area through work samples, discussions, or records.
